Tim Wilbanks Presentation

- Tim owns Heritage Honeybee in Sullivan, WI and is a 5th Generation Beekeeper.
- Most bees produced in the USA went to Canada
 - 1986-87 Tracheal and Varroa Mite regulations prevented sales to Canada
 - Many producers went out of business.
 - o 1950s-80s it was common practice to kill bees in the fall so higher demand in spring
 - Now people are trying to sustain bees so less demand in spring
- Producers that made it through the 80s are at the forefront and now passing the business to the next generation or being sold.
 - New people and new era will mean changes to come in the near future
- He talked about making packages and showed lots of pictures
 - o Queen rearing is mid-May to mid-July, this is honey flow in midwest-so not many do it

Jan. 19, 2019

- Commercial Producers need healthy bees, ideal weather, and good location
- Weather is the most critical factor in quality queens, fly high and mate with many drones
- o Packages need ample air flow and to be kept cool in transit
- o Transported colonies don't thermoregulate and it affects the brood.
